

Minutes of Cedarville Village Council

Held May 26, 2020 (day after Memorial Day)

Council met in regular session on May 26, 2020 with Mayor Pergram presiding. *Due to concerns regarding Coronavirus (COVID-19), this meeting was held via "Zoom" for those that felt the need to stay home.* Council members present were Brooks, Chisholm, Dawes, Stancliff, Terrell(Z) and Ware. ("Z" = Zoom). The Fiscal Officer recorded the minutes.

Minutes: Minutes of the May 11, 2020 meeting were accepted as submitted.

Mayor Pergram:

- Flooding during (very) heavy rains in several sections of town: 72N, Miller St., Wilmington Rd., Regency Dr., Elm St. Village employees working to make sure that drains / culverts are clear; not much else can be done.
- Mayor requests that Village Administrator replace the window A/C units in the police offices.
- Mayor highlighted need for the Village to develop a record retention policy for Village documents. Solicitor concurs.
- Met with Scott from NIC (National Inspection Corporation). They are ready to begin serving as the Village of Cedarville Building Department on 6/1/2020.

Police Chief Combs:

- 311 calls since last report.
- Attempting to get C Kellum back on duty. He will return his badge until authorized to work for the Village.
- Meeting with architect this week to talk about the Legion building project.
- State firearms qualifications completed for all officers.

Village Administrator Furay:

- Several weed notices have been sent. Several have already taken care of the issues.
- New playground equipment has arrived and will be installed in the next couple of weeks.
